## This week we will be:

**Reading:** Students will read "The Journey-Stories of Migration." These are short stories about other animals like the Monarch butterflies, which students will compare and contrast using textual evidence. Students will also illustrate their own butterfly and label it with Spanish words.

**Religion:** Students prepare themselves for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. They will learn about the **Easter Triduum**.

<u>Math</u>: Students took their 10s test today. We also introduced the 11 facts and students will be tested on these on Monday, April 16<sup>th</sup>. The measurement/time test will be sent home on Wednesday. We also begin a new chapter on perimeter and area.

**Language Arts:** Students continue to work on their Passion books. This week we read and summarize "The Agony in the Garden" and "Jesus is Arrested".

<u>Second Step</u>: We will begin a new unit on Emotion Management. Students will learn that when they feel strong feelings, it is hard to think clearly. Students learned how focusing their body will give them clues about how they are feeling and how thinking about their feelings will help the thinking part of their brain get back in control.

**Science:** Students will continue studying the properties of magnets this week.
