Reminders:

This week, we will be learning:

Reading: We continue reading *Life on the Ice*, an informational text about the North and South poles. Our target skill is main ideas and details.

Math: Today we focus on the 6s multiplication and division facts. We also begin a new chapter on measurement. This week we focus on capacity and mass.

Language Arts: We are working on our final drafts! Your kids are working so hard and I can't wait to see the final projects. We also do some fun activities to celebrate Dr. Seuss' birthday on Friday!

Science: This week students will observe the hermit crabs in the revised crabitats. They will then make a second round of changes to their crabitat.

Social Studies: We continue to learn about the importance of totem poles to the Northwest Coast people. Students have a chance to write their own totem poles stories. We also learn the next section of states in our GeoJourney.

Religion: We will discuss and illustrate the Creed. Students will understand that the Church helps us know what to believe as stated in the Creed. They will identify key phrases in the Apostles' Creed: the Father Almighty, Jesus, His only Son, and in the Holy Spirit.
