Reminders

Native American Projects:

Curriculum

Reading: Students read the informational text <u>Mountains</u>: <u>Surviving on Everest</u>. They search for informational text features and write about what the conditions are like on Everest.

<u>Math</u>: Students learn the 8 facts and will be tested next Monday. We continue to work on measurement chapter. This week we focus on telling time to the minute and elapsed time.

Language Arts: Students will present their Native American projects to the class this week.

Religion: Throughout Lent students will be writing and illustrating their own book on the Passion Story. We will use language arts time and some religion time for this project. Later on, they will present these booklets to the kindergarteners and first graders. Students will work on their summarization skills.

Science: We will begin a new unit on magnets and transportation engineering. This week students will learn about the role of transportation engineers, learn to identify and define a system, and learn to identify and explain the steps of the Engineering Design Process.

<u>Social Studies</u>: We will start our next unit on economy. Students will learn about supply and demand. We will go through different scenarios and students will have to decide what will happen to the price of certain items when the demand or supply changes.
