<u>This week we are learning:</u>

READING NOVEL UNITS:

Boxcar Children: This is such a fun story! We use the *'break-apart'* strategy for decoding, making sure to voice each sound and blend continuously. We also work on *"swoop-swoop"* reading for smoothness & fluency and visualization for comprehension.

<u>*Mr. Poppers Penguins</u>: The children are enjoying the humor in this novel. Our target skill is sequencing the main event.*</u>

READING LOGS: Students should read 20 minutes a night and be marking the October log. Students should be reading at least ONE <u>fiction</u> chapter book this month in order to successfully complete the mini-book report on the back of the log.

LANGUAGE ARTS: We begin writing a descriptive paragraph about fall. This week we go outside and use all of our senses to observe fall.

MATH: We review subtraction with regrouping and subtracting across zero. All of the steps can be tricky, please make sure you are checking your child's homework. Thanks for your help!

<u>SOCIAL STUDIES:</u> We continue our study of geography. This week we learn about the different bodies of water and we learn our first two regions of states in our GeoJourney.

SCIENCE: We conclude our unit on animal life cycles.

<u>RELIGION</u>: We finish our project on St. Francis and learn about the Mysteries of the Rosary. We practice the **"Come Holy Spirit"** prayer.
