This week we are learning:

READING NOVEL UNITS:

<u>Boxcar Children:</u> This week, we read chapters 11-12 while students practice writing summary sentences. .

Mr. Popper's Penguins: Students read chapters 19-20 to identify character traits using text evidence and visualize what we're reading. Students will also take their final test on the book.

<u>READING LOGS:</u> Students have new logs for December. Have fun with it! Read Christmas stories together and cozy chapter books by the fire. There is NOT a mini-book report/back for the month of December.

<u>LANGUAGE ARTS:</u> We practice our Christmas Poems and write some fun Christmas stories.

MATH: We continue with our chapter on division. This week we talk about the relationship between division and multiplication and how they are inverse operations.

<u>RELIGION:</u> We use this time to prepare for confession.

<u>Science/Social Studies:</u> We use our science and social studies times to practice for the Nativity play. .

Religion: This Wednesday, December 6th, students will be receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation with Fr. Oakland.
